It used to be fashion that everyone wanted to get into bed with. Now design is the new sex, of course, which means that a new design awards scheme is being born every minute. OK, slight exaggeration there, but there certainly are increasing numbers of high-profile companies supporting designers with increasingly generous cash prizes. Peugeot set up its Design Awards in 1998 with a healthy £27,000 fund, and the overall winner walks off with a

stonking £15,000. Last year Hector Serrano cleaned up with his Superpatata lamp (right) and has used the money to finance research into his next showstopping product. Next year, who knows? Applications for the Peugeot Design Awards 2001 are being sought now from designers and applied artists working in any of the five categories: ceramics & glass, lighting, furniture, domestic metalware & silversmithing and textiles. The object submitted must



have been designed and made in the previous 12 months to February 1 2001. The closing date for completed applications is 28 February 2001.
